Special Education Department Reorganization

Our Special Education Department is going through a transformation as we reorganize our departmental work. In years prior, there were two Directors leading separate teams at the elementary and secondary levels. This year, we are functioning as one department and jointly supporting students Preschool through Adult School, ages 3-22, without the elementary and secondary divisions. Cindy and Amanda have both had long and varied experiences in education that complement our each other and our leadership in the department.

Our District team launched the 2022-23 school year by spending two days together at a retreat to discuss our reorganization, analyze our team strengths, and set forth priorities for the year. We also spent time defining and the roles and responsibilities of our District team that include Coordinators, Program Specialists, a Mental Health Manager, a Behavior Manager, and Office Staff. Community Building

In addition to building our District team, we are honored to be in close collaboration with our Palo Alto CAC organization. Along with PTAC, we co-hosted a Fall community building event, "Family Fun Day", on, September 18, at Addison School. PAUSD staff and families of children with IEPs, 504s, and/or learning differences were invited and despite the questionable weather, it was a great turnout! We were grateful for the many community partners at the event who provided the following activities: building using the creativity cart offered by the PAUSD Curriculum & Career Education, story time hosted by Paly Child Development Pathways, art and science hosted by the Innovation Youth and Boy Scout Troop 52, and music played by Son and Dad Garageband by a Gunn Student. Additionally, participants enjoyed Artisan cookies & lemonade provided by Ada's Cafe. We are looking forward to planning and hosting more community building events this year!

Professional Development Days

One of the most valuable aspects of working in PAUSD are the plentiful opportunities for staff to participate in a variety of growth opportunities and trainings. We launched the year with training in one of our priority areas, Co-Teaching; a learning model where a general education and special education work together to deliver instruction to a variety of students. In August, Administrators from Paly, Gunn, JLS, Fletcher, Greene, Briones, and Greendell participated in a focused session hosted by the Santa Clara County Office of Education (SCCOE) on how to build inclusive practices through Co-Teaching. Throughout September and October, Teachers from these sites are participating in a similar training with their co-teaching partners. After the initial training, coaches from SCCOE will be observing the co-teaching classrooms to offer feedback and provide next steps for collaboration. We will continue with cycles of inquiry and reflection and hope to expand the learning opportunities to the other PAUSD sites next year.

Our Sped Aides have also been growing their skills this year. During our August and October Staff Development days, Aides participated in the following trainings: Safety Care, Instructional Assistant Onboarding, or Accommodations & Modifications- How to Support Students with IEPs in General, and Understanding the (13) Areas of Special Ed Eligibility. Our Aides play a crucial role in our student supports and we are grateful that they are eager to learn.

Our Mild/Moderate Sped Teachers have been engaged in learning new District curriculum and assessments. This year, Elementary Education is implementing a new English Language Arts and Science Curriculum. Additionally, Teachers have been trained in our new i-Ready assessments which will measure reading skills and provide data on possible IEP goals.

Our Moderate/Severe/Futures Teachers have also been exploring a variety of curriculum this year. For the 2022-23 school year, PAUSD purchased Unique so our Program Specialists and PATCH teams have been visiting individual classes to work 1:1 with our teachers in addition to hosting an overview during our August Staff Development Day. During our October Staff Development Day, we continued to explore other programs including Star/Links, Teachtown, and Readtopia so that we could compare content and usability of these various programs in preK- post secondary as we hone in on preferred curriculum. All of these professional development opportunities align with one of our Key Strategies in the PAUSD Promise- Special Education and Inclusion: *Provide standards aligned curriculum and materials for classrooms supporting students with extensive service needs uniformly from elementary through secondary programs*.

Alternative Programs at Cubberly

PAUSD is proud to offer Alternative Programs at Cubberley for students in grades 6-12. The Intensive Individualized Program (IIP) provides personalized learning through a combination of individual and small group, direct instruction. Students spend approximately 10-20 hours per week on academic work. Students who may benefit from the program include those who may need a smaller, more intimate learning environment, 5th year students with significant credit deficiencies, students desiring to take GED or CHSPE and students transitioning from a Non-Public School or Residential Treatment Center.

This year, PAUSD launched its second alternative program at Cubberley, the Intensive Therapeutic Program (ITP). This program also serves students in grades 6-12 whose mental health, behavioral, and emotional difficulties have resulted in impairment of major life activities and require supportive and intensive interventions. Educational Specialist and Mental Health Therapist work together to

provide therapeutic activities including individual and group therapy, behavior management, crisis intervention, and family therapy as needed.

We are proud to offer alternative programs to our students in PAUSD with IEPs in lieu of non-public school placements. Our department is continuing to consider how to expand and offer additional alternative placements at all grade levels with a variety of supports.
